Rudi Oss CEDEC President

Rudi Oss is the Chairman of Dolomiti Energia, Trenta, Confservizi of Trentino Alto Adige and of Miscellaneous Industries Section, which includes the energy sector of Confindustria Trento. Since the mid-1990s has been active in politics as President (2002-2007) with the Trentino Tyrolean Autonomist Party. Oss holds a Master degree in transnational law. He became CEDEC President in 2014 and will hold this title until 2016.



Maroš Šefčovič European Commission Vice-President on the Energy Union

Maros Sefcovic is Vice-President of the European Commission, in charge of the Energy Union. His area of responsibility includes the establishing of a European Energy Union by connecting infrastructures and enforcing legislation to help drive down costs for citizens and businesses, improve energy security, mobilize additional investment in power grids, renewable energy installations and other energy infrastructure, and improve energy efficiency.



<u>Peter van Kemseke</u>

Member of Cabinet, Commission Vice-President of the Energy Union

Peter Van Kemseke studied contemporary history and global politics and holds a PhD in the history of international relations. In 2001, he joined the Belgian diplomatic service until 2009, when he joined the Permanent Representation of Belgium to the EU. Peter was acting COREPER I-Ambassador, before joining the cabinet of the Belgian Foreign Affairs Minister (2011) and of the Belgian Vice Prime Minister/Finance Minister (2012). In November 2012, he started working as deputy head of Cabinet of Van Rompuy and in 2014 he became member of Cabinet of the Vice-President for the Energy Union.



Annemarie Jorritsma

President, Council of European Municipalities and Regions, The Netherlands

Annemarie Jorritsma is President of the Council of European Municipalities and Regions (CEMR) since December 2013. She is also Vice President of the European Section of United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG). Ms Jorritsma was Mayor of Almere (Netherlands) till September 2015 and has been a member of the Dutch Senate since June 2015. From 1994 to 1998, she was Minister of Transport, Public Works and Water Management. From 1998 to 2002, she used to be Vice Prime Minister of the Netherlands and Minister of Economic Affairs. Until June 2015, she was President of CEMR national Association of Netherlands Municipalities, VNG.

Member of the Board, National Energy Ombudsmen Network (NEON)

Eric Houtman is the Belgian energy ombudsman (Dutch-speaking) since 2009. With 10 years' experience as an expert in income tax, he began working in 2000 for the Deputy Prime Minister and Budget Minister as the Adviser for fiscal affairs, budget, energy, environment and sustainable development; and then from 2008 as the Deputy Cabinet Director in the office of the Federal Minister for Climate and Energy.

In 2010 the Belgian energy ombudsman was the founding member of NEON (National Energy Ombudsman Network), an independent, not for profit Europe-wide network made up of ombudsmen and mediation services in the energy sector.

He is also part of the Executive Committee of the Consumer Ombudsman Service, launched in June 2015 as an umbrella entity for the alternative resolution of consumer disputes by economic sectors in Belgium.

Mr Clerens studied law at the University of Saarbrücken and the University of Mainz. Since 1996, he has worked as a consultant for a private company specialising in European Affairs in Brussels. In his capacity as Brussels Representative of different European associations, he has been involved in the climate and energy field since 2003.

He has managed the EASE office in Brussels as Secretary General since its foundation in September 2011. EASE believes that energy storage is an indispensable instrument to improve the stability and flexibility of the energy system with respect to European energy and climate policy. EASE aims to support the transition towards a sustainable energy system in Europe.

The importance of energy storage for the European industry is well demonstrated: EASE has grown from the initial 13 founding members in September 2011 to the current 40.

Jan Panek is Head of Unit dealing with retail energy markets, coal and oil in the Directorate-General for Energy of the European Commission in Brussels. Member of the United Nations Committee of Experts on Public Administration, CEPA (2010-2013).

She led the Italian delegation for Energy and Climate Change at G8, United Nations and OECD (2007-8) and has served in Government Commissions of experts in the field of regulation, energy and climate change, governance of public utilities and of financial markets.
