CONCESSIONS

20.12.2012 The European Commission has published a proposal for a directive on the award of concession contracts. It aims to complete the European public procurement regime by including service concessions, the only concession not yet governed by secondary legislation. The proposed rules aim to establish a clear legal framework to ensure the necessary legal certainty for public authorities when performing their duties. The Commission's proposal is now sent to the European Parliament and Council of Ministers for adoption under the co-decision procedure.

06.12.2011 The European Commission has launched a public consultation on Renewable Energy Strategy. This public consultation has the aim of soliciting the view of interested parties to assess in how far the orientations of the current policy framework remain valid in the medium term until 2030. The public consultation will close on 7 February 2012.
